Clinical Vignettes for the Presentation

Case 1 – Mary is an active 60 y/o who reports a 4-month history of right-sided groin pain and lateral hip pain. She rates her pain as being 4-5/10 with activity. This interferes with her recreational activities of walking her dog several miles each day, hiking, and golf. Radiographs of her right hip demonstrate a Kellgren and Lawrence grade of 2. She reports taking NSAIDs for pain and is also on some blood pressure medication. Otherwise, her past medical history is unremarkable. She is referred to her by a TCO orthopedic surgeon for a trial of PT. Her daughter is getting married in 6-weeks in Colorado.

Case 2- Paul is a 35 y/o male who works as an Actuary in downtown St Paul. He reports a 1-month history of lateral elbow pain. Last week his pain was 6-7/10, and he had difficulty gripping and grasping objects. He has a membership to the local Vertical Endeavors indoor climbing gym and has not been able to go secondary to his forearm pain. He also reports avoiding specific exercises at the Y when he lifts weights. He has a history of right knee ACL tear and surgical reconstruction. He has tried taking NSAIDs for his pain and denies any other medical problems and medications. He and his wife just had their first child 3-months ago.
